

Be it remembered that on the 27th day of July 1846
the last Will and Testament of Amasa Spencer late
of Cuming County in the State of Indiana deceased
was duly proved before the Clerk of the Probate Court of
said County and is in the words and figures following
to-wit:

I Amasa Spencer of the County of Cuming
and State of Indiana being old and infirm but
of sound mind and memory, in view of the
uncertainty of life do make this to be my last Will
and Testament and, all former Wills are hereby
revoked.

1st I Will and bequeath to my Wife Priscilla Spencer
the use possession and occupancy of the room
in my dwelling house which we the said Priscilla
and myself now occupy, and the use possession
rents and profits of the same until part of all my
lands during her natural life if she shall remain
my widow. If she shall choose to rent out the
premises above bequeathed to her or to accept a
decient and comfortable support in lieu of the use
and possession of the same, then my son Nathan
Jackson Spencer shall have the preference in renting
the same or in furnishing such support.

2nd I bequeath to my said wife Priscilla all the
personal property which she brought to my house
after our Marriage, and the one half of all the
personal property that we may have jointly ac-
quired and made since our Marriage together
with her wearing apparel, all of which is to be
given up to her at my death if she shall survive
me, and to her Children if she shall die before
me, and the said property shall not have been
previously given up - which is agreeable to our

verbal agreement before our marriage -

2. Upon condition that my son Nathaniel Jackson Spencer shall continue with me through my life and assist me to acquire a comfortable support in my old age. I bequeath to him all my lands and tenements, consisting of the west half of the North west quarter of Section number twenty five and the South East fourth of the North West quarter of Section twenty four in Township six North of Range seven East. in Jackson County aforesaid provided the said Nathaniel Jackson Spencer shall pay to my Children herein after named or to the Executor for their use and benefit the sum of fifty dollars in three years in consideration of the said forty acre tract of land before mentioned

I bequeath to James Spencer Samuel Spencer

Robert Spencer David Spencer Jane Combette Moses Spencer Anna Parsby Annisa Spencer wife of Peter Mink Nancy Fitzgerald and Polly M. Whorton each two dollars, and to the Children of Peggy Smith a Childs part or two dollars - Polly Mink is intentionally excluded from any participation in my Estate - for the purpose of paying my just debts funeral expenses and the above bequests I direct that so much of my personal Estate be sold as may be necessary for these purposes, and if after paying my debts as aforesaid there shall not be enough to pay the bequests aforesaid then I direct that the residue of the money arising from said sale be equally divided among my aforesaid Children and the Children of Peggy Smith as aforesaid with the exclusion aforesaid - and

if any money remains after paying the above
debits. I bequeath the said remainder to my
son Matthew Jackson Spicer subject to the
conditions expressed in the 3^d item of this will
I hereby constitute and appoint Egan L. Pabody
sole Executor of this my last will and testament
